Business Experience and Management Skills

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Demonstrable Business Background

Candidates must showcase relevant experience in business ownership or senior management positions to qualify for the program.

Managerial Competence Requirement

A minimum of three years as a business owner or four years as a senior manager is essential for eligibility.

Role of Active Management

Applicants must commit to actively managing their proposed business within the community to ensure its success.

Contribution to Local Economy

Entrepreneurs are expected to contribute significantly to the economic vitality of the community they engage.

Financial Requirements for Applicants

Minimum Personal Net Worth

Applicants must possess a verified personal net worth of at least CAD 300,000, ensuring financial stability.

◆ Investment Commitment

A minimum investment of CAD 100,000 into the proposed business is a prerequisite for application under this stream.





Language and Community Engagement Requirements

Mandatory Language Proficiency

A minimum Canadian Language Benchmark (CLB) level of 4 in English or French is required for registration.

Exploratory Visit Prerequisite

An in-person exploratory visit to the community is mandatory to understand local opportunities and lifestyle.

Community Engagement Focus

Candidates must engage with community representatives and align their business proposals with local priorities.

O Referral from Community Required

A community referral is a critical requirement before submitting a registration under this program.



Long-term Business Sustainability


Demonstrating business sustainability is key to supporting applications for permanent residency in Canada.
